ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

BACKGROUND

Africa Business Ethics Conference (ABEC) is an annual conference that brings together the private sector, government, civil society and the media fraternity to discuss issues around business ethics.

This forum, mooted and organized by Milestones Resource Solutions was first hosted in 2019 after which there have been four iterations in various regions of Africa including East Africa (Kenya), West Africa (Nigeria) and Southern Africa (Botswana). Center for International Private Enterprise (CIPE) has been a core funding partner of each of these conferences that have enabled national discourse on the law, policy, strategies and opportunities around the issues of business ethics.

In each conference, different themes have been explored as detailed below. These overarching themes have provided opportunity to undertake advocacy, collaborate on interventions and provide platforms for the profiling of ethics initiatives

Since 2019, ABEC has grown significantly, starting with 222 delegates from countries like Kenya, the USA, Nigeria, Zimbabwe, France, and Mauritius. Adapting to a hybrid format in 2020, it continued to expand, attracting 430 delegates in 2021. Returning to an in-person format in 2023. ABEC welcomed participants from over 25 countries, including Botswana, South Africa, Kenya, Nigeria, Algeria, and the UK. This growth highlights ABEC's rising importance as a key platform for addressing ethical challenges in African business.




She is a titular member of the Governing Body of the ILO and serves as the Secretary-General of BUSINESS Africa Employers' Confederation, the employers'





Checchi also led the development of international frameworks for exchange of best practices and peer to peer assistance among anti- corruption practitioners.








